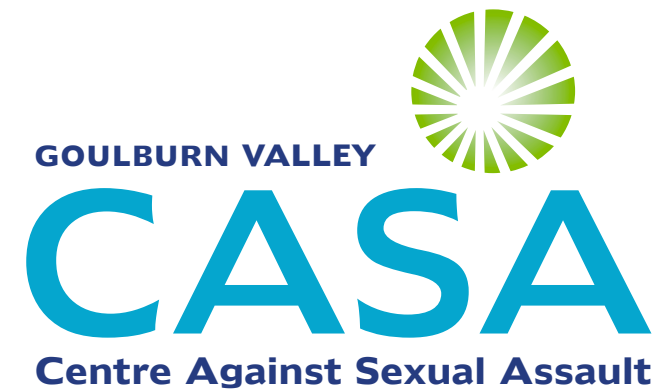

What is sexual assault?

Sexual assault is any behaviour of a sexual nature that makes someone feel uncomfortable, frightened, intimidated or threatened. It is sexual behaviour that someone has not agreed to, where another person uses physical or emotional force against them. Sexual assault is an abuse of power. Sexual assault is never the fault or the responsibility of the victim/survivor. It does not matter what your relationship is to the other person, if you did not give consent freely and willingly, it is sexual assault.

Sexual assault can include sexual harassment, unwanted exposure to pornography, being photographed or filmed in a sexual nature without consent, stalking, unwanted touching and rape.

If you experience sexual assault you are NOT to blame; the blame sits with the person who has assaulted you.

What is consent?

Consent is when someone agrees, gives permission, or says 'yes' to sexual activity with other persons. Consent is always freely given and you can stop wanting to participate in sexual activities or say no at ANY time...even if you have already said yes.

Who does sexual assault happen to?

Sexual assault can happen to anyone, regardless of age, gender, social status, race, culture or ability. Contrary to popular belief, 25 percent or less of reported sexual assault are committed by a stranger to the person, most people are sexually assaulted by someone they know.

CASA's Commitment

The Victorian Centres Against Sexual Assault are committed to addressing the inequalities within society which result in the perpetration of sexual violence and family violence against women, children and men.

Everyone has the right to live free from violence and abuse.

Who can use the CASA services?

Women, men and children who have experienced recent or past sexual assault, their non-offending family members, partners or friends.

GVCASA **does not** offer services to perpetrators of sexual assault.

Services we provide

- Therapeutic counselling and advocacy for victims/survivors of sexual assault and their non-offending families, partners and friends.
- 24/7 crisis care response to victim/survivors of recent sexual assault.
- Group counselling and support available.
- Community education for community/professional groups, schools and other organisations.
- GVCASA proudly provides the Bravehearts "Ditto Show", a personal safety program to kindergartens and primary schools within our region.
- Secondary consultations (including debriefing).
- Interpreters available (on request).
